Who remembers the Golden Age of Radio? That was when we sat around the radio waiting to hear shows like the Lone Ranger, the Shadow, and Amos and Andy. The acting relied on voice, and sound effects helped us visualize the scene. Even if you’re young enough not to experience radio, Jack Barry will give us the opportunity right here at Lakeview Village.

First, let’s introduce Jack and his wife Colleen. Now where’s that drum roll sound effect? Oh right, this is the written word, no sound effects. Jack’s love of the golden era of radio prompted him to create an old-time radio theater company, The Theater of Your Mind. He has presented live radio plays much like the productions from the 30s through the 50s in Sacramento and Paradise accompanied by a 60-piece orchestra.

During these shows, presented in front of a live studio audience, actors read from scripts and sound effects were created right on stage. “If you are someone who sat around listening to the radio or wish you had lived when radio was ‘golden’ these productions will speak to you,” says Jack.

Radio was the first broadcast medium, and a variety of new entertainment formats and genres were created including quiz shows, variety hours, situation comedies, children’s shows and Jack’s favorite, radio plays.

Jack started his broadcast career as a radio announcer in 1970 after serving 6 years in the Air Force. He worked at radio stations in Eugene and Portland, Oregon and later in Chico, California. In 1983, he founded an

advertising agency and audio-video production company. Unfortunately, he sold the company in 2000 after suffering from a spinal cord accident while filming a documentary in Africa.

He may have sold his company, but Jack never lost his love for bringing old-time radio to the masses. And it didn't stop him from meeting and marrying Colleen 7 years ago.

"We met through Match.com," says Colleen. "And our first date was at Black Angus." "It was love at first sight," says Jack. "We were together for 2 years and then got married in Hawaii."

Colleen's history shows an active woman who was a competitive water skier and winner of the US water skiing championship at age 17. She went on to become a competitive snow skier, competing in slalom downhill skiing, and she taught water skiing. Colleen's athletic abilities on the slope morphed into her creating/designing snow ski jackets. But that's not all, she also became a real estate broker.

Their history together has them living nearby in Crosswoods, moving to Texas, coming back to California, and then moving to Lakeview Village in June. "We love it here," says Jack. "We've been to the Halloween party and Thanksgiving dinner."

And they are looking forward to bringing their radio show to us live in Lakeview Village. If you'd like to be a part of the show, they are holding auditions on Saturday, April 13 at 1 p.m. in the clubhouse.

"We do this for fun and to get people together," says Jack.

They may live in a retirement community, but Jack is semi-retired, still doing voice overs, editing podcasts, and making advertisers sound good—all from his home studio. He follows his own advice to work hard. Are you ready to enjoy Jack's hard work? Begin by auditioning and then coming to his radio show in June.

### **Chili Cookoff Results —**

We had a great time at our 1st annual Lakeview Chili Cookoff on Saturday, January 13<sup>th</sup>. There were 15 entries and residents who attended



tasted a delicious variety of chili. Plus, it was a Happy2Hours so drinks were discounted. After some serious tasting and judging, the winners were: 1st place Terry Bales, 2nd place Don Buchanan, and 3rd place was a tie between Karen Franklin and Joan Wyatt.

**Chili Baked Potato Topping** – I thought I'd stay with the chili theme and share the chili topping we used at our Happy2Hour baked potato bar. My son-in-law says this is real Texas chili with no beans.

### **Ingredients –**

2 pounds beef chuck, tri-tip or any other beef cut  
 2 teaspoons olive oil  
 1 onion diced  
 1– 8 ounce can tomato sauce  
 1– 10 ounce can diced tomatoes & green chilies  
 1- clove garlic minced  
 1-1/2 cups Texas beer  
 1 tablespoon chili powder  
 1 tablespoon ground cumin  
 1/4 teaspoon cayenne  
 Salt to taste  
 2 tablespoons corn meal

If you have a meat grinder, grind the meat coarsely or cut it into small cubes. Heat a large Dutch oven on high heat add half the oil and brown the beef. Work in small batches. Don't overcrowd the pan or you'll end up stewing the meat instead of browning it. Remove the beef and set aside to drain. Add the remaining oil and onion and cook until nicely browned. Add back in the beef, along with garlic, chili powder, cayenne, cumin, and salt. Stir to combine. Add in the beer, diced tomatoes & green chilies, and tomato sauce. Bring to a low simmer, cover, and cook at a low simmer for about 1 hour. Taste and adjust seasoning. If chili is too thin stir in the corn meal. If it's too thick, thin with water to your desired consistency.

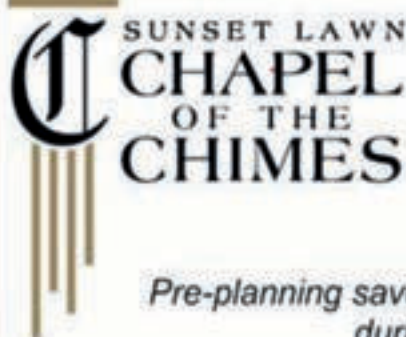

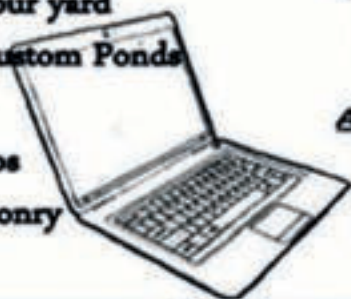
