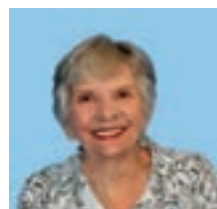

**Easy Lemon Chicken** – I like chicken with a buttery lemon sauce. I recently ran across a simple recipe with a tasty sauce. I tried it and will cook it frequently. I do like easy.

#### **Ingredients**

2 large boneless skinless chicken breasts

Salt & pepper to taste

1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

Flour for dredging

1 tablespoon olive oil

3 tablespoons butter, divided

1/2 cup chicken broth

2 tablespoons lemon juice

Zest of 1/2 the lemon

Chopped fresh parsley

#### **Directions**

- Cut your chicken breasts in half lengthwise so you have thinner cutlets. If cutlets are uneven, pound chicken breasts to even. Sprinkle cutlets with salt, pepper, and garlic. Dredge with flour.
- Add the olive oil and 1 tablespoon of butter to a skillet over medium-high heat. Once the pan is hot, add the chicken cutlets and cook them until they're nice and golden on both sides. Take chicken out of the pan and set aside.

- Add the chicken broth, lemon juice, zest and remaining 2 tablespoons butter to the pan. Let it bubble for 2 minutes.
- Put the chicken back in pan and cook for another few minutes until the chicken is cooked through and the sauce is reduced. Season with salt and pepper. Sprinkle with chopped parsley.

## **GARDEN TALK**

Take a walk and look around the FREE garden plots! You will see that several are getting out on the nice days and starting to prep for the spring gardens. Get the spring bug! Go to the management office and

confirm your FREE plot or give it up for the year if you don't plan to plant this year. If you don't have a plot yet get to the management office and get one or get on the waiting list. Get out there and start getting ready for planting.

### **I suggest you set a Gardening Prep Saturday.**

- Come with your tools and gloves ready to prep and plant.
- Bring a son, grandson, daughter, neighbor, friend... to help you.
- Get the big weeds taken out of your garden.
- The acceptable norm is to just dig around where you are going to plant.
- It is not always best to rotor tiller your garden, as it just spreads and propagates the weeds.
- Use guide to choose which seeds to start indoors and when.

### **Some good ideas for potting your seedlings.**

- Use paper pots or pots that you can just plant in ground w/Drainage holes.
- Tray without holes to set pots in (cookie sheet, salad container... use your imagination look on YouTube for ideas and suggestions)

- Some type of growing lights and a small heater (shop light, LED light, ... Home Depot.)
- Use potting soil with fertilizer (don't skimp here, get the good stuff)
- Use rainwater on your seedlings or let your tap water set for a few days in open container.
- Pre-wet the potting soil (first watering does not absorb readily) Water with a spray bottle.
- Plant more than you need (some seeds don't germinate, or you can share seedlings with others)
- As the daytime weather reaches 50-60's put your seedlings out in the sun. Don't forget to bring them in during cold nights.
- Don't bother with seedlings if you are not committed to the care for 6-8 weeks. It will be a waste of your time and money. Remember that Jan-March are wet and cold and a time to stay at home anyway. It will give you something positive and rewarding to do. Just watch those green plants thrive under your care.

**This is a time we all do the following with fellow gardeners:**

- Share left over seeds among each other.
- Share a sunflower seed or two for your plot
- Share ideas for watering and keeping down the weeds.
- Share your garden in exchange for some of the goodies.

If you get stuck in sand or light snow, put your car mats, nubby side up, in front of rear tires. This gives some extra traction. Slowly start forward. Voila!

Don't toss the wrappers from butter, save them in a baggie for the next time you need to grease a pan with ease.

When shucking corn by hand, turn to your microwave. First cut off bottom of the corn cob where the stalk meets the first row of kernels. Put corn on a micro safe plate and zap for 30-60 seconds. Remove and hold by the uncut end and give it a firm shake and the cob should slide out leaving the husk and silk behind.

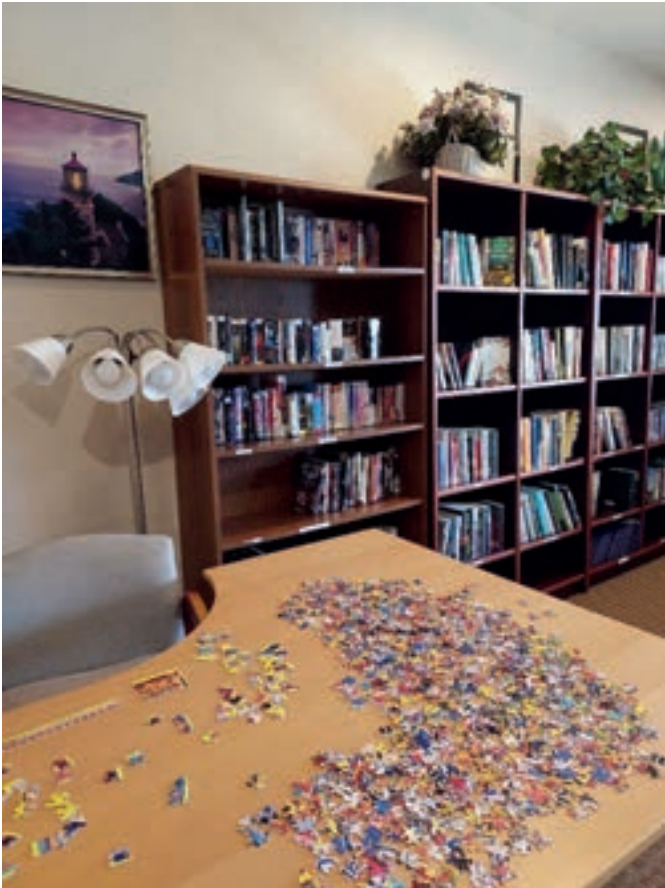


When celery is ripening, the last chemical it gets is chlorophyll. That makes it greener, but it doesn't taste very good, so when you're buying celery - the lighter the color the better the flavor.

If you want celery to last a very long time, treat it like you would flowers. Cut off the bottom, rinse it off, and put it in a large glass or pitcher full of water. Cover the whole thing with the produce bag, tuck it underneath, and put it in the refrigerator. If it's too tall you can trim the bottom again.

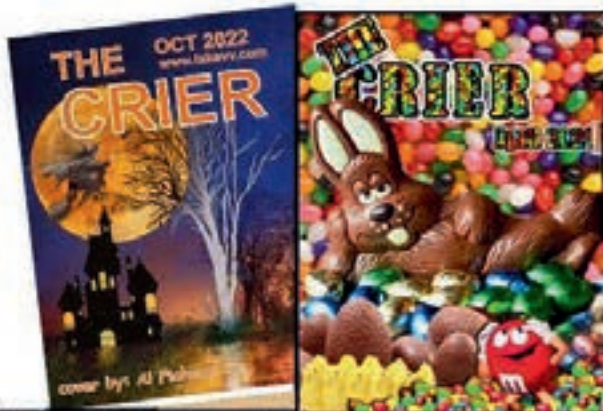

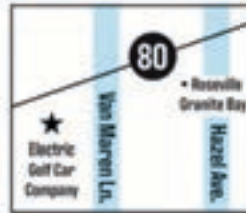

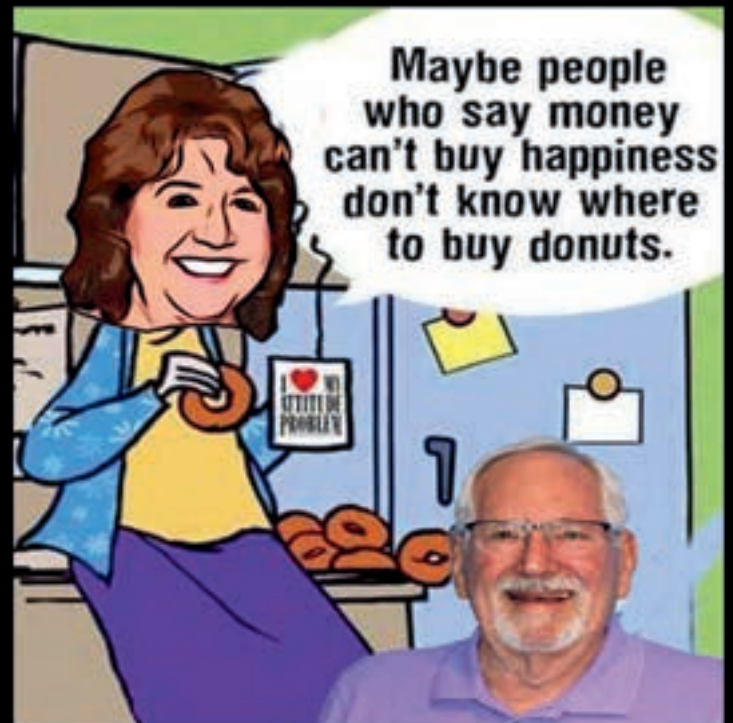
