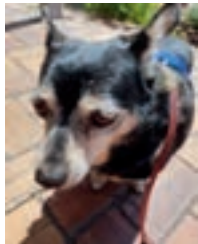

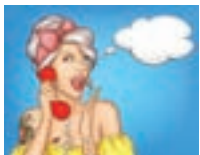

ACAPULCO COCKTAIL

- 2/3 oz Dark Meyers Rum
- 1 oz Gold Tequila
- 1 oz Coffee Liqueur (*Kahlua is rum infused with arabica coffee beans, sugar, and vanilla.*)
- 1/2 oz Coconut Cream (*Real Gourmet Cream of Coconut available in liquor departments.*)
- Combine ingredients with ice in a shaker. Shake and strain into a cocktail glass. Garnish with a cherry.

PASSION COCKTAIL

- 1 oz Grand Marnier (A blend of **Cognac brandy**, essence of **bitter orange**, and **sugar**.)
- 1 oz Gold Tequila
- 1 1/2 oz Cranberry Juice
- 1/2 oz Lime Juice
- Combine ingredients with ice in a shaker. Shake well and strain into a chilled cocktail glass. Garnish with a slice of lime.

Who will be the champion?

Roaster Oven Corned Beef and Cabbage

I never really enjoyed corned beef. It was too salty and plain for my taste. About 4 years ago I tried 5 ways to cook corned beef and the following recipe was the one I liked best.

Ingredients

- 3 cups low sodium beef stock

- 2 (4 to 5 pounds each) corned beef with seasoning packet
- 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 3 tablespoons brown mustard
- 3 tablespoons catsup
- 1 large head of cabbage, quartered
- 7 medium red potatoes, halved

Instructions

1. Remove rack from roaster oven. In roaster oven insert pan, stir together broth & spices.
2. Heat roaster oven to 325 degrees.
3. In a small bowl, stir together brown sugar, mustard, and catsup. Set aside.
4. Rinse corned beef and pat dry. Place on rack. Use roaster rack to place corned beef in roaster oven. Ladle broth mixture over corned beef.
5. Cover & roast for 2-1/2 -3 hours.
6. Spread brown sugar mixture on top & sides of meat. Arrange cabbage & potatoes around meat.
7. Cover & cook until meat is fork tender.
8. Remove cabbage & potatoes to a serving bowl.
9. Using oven mitts, remove meat to a cutting board. Let meat stand for 10 minutes. Remove meat from rack before slicing.

Potlucks or Happy2Hour – When should I bring food?

– I've been asked this question frequently. Potlucks are the events when residents are asked to bring a dish to share. We have different types of potlucks, full meals such as St. Patrick's Day and appetizer potlucks for our Art & Wine Faire and New Year's Eve. We serve food 1 hour after a potluck begins. The first hour of a potluck is time to socialize.

Happy2Hour food is provided by the Lakeview Villagers' Association to thank residents for participating in fundraising and other events. Money is budgeted and used by the kitchen

committee to purchase supplies for these events. We have many themed Happy2Hours and try to provide appetizers to go with each theme. The kitchen committee plans on serving 100 – 125 people in 2 servings at each event. Consider Happy2Hours your night off.

Another question I'm asked is may I bring a food donation to a Happy2Hour? Of course you can.

We're happy to provide serving items for your use. If your donation won't serve everyone, you can share it with your people at your table. For larger donations, please contact Diane Perry at 408-242-3502 so we'll be sure to have everything you need to serve your food.

NEIGHBORHOOD AWARENESS

I'd like to thank everyone who reported incidents this past month. Yes, there have been a few. I've had several reports of suspicious looking people and vehicles that are either lost or up to no good.

Unfortunately, we lost a few bags of bottles and cans-I was given the impression "we know who you are!" Gee, I wonder what that means?

We have confirmation from our awesome association president, Leslie B., that CHPD has suggested we should just use the emergency 911 number when calling them. Start your conversation with: *"I'm in Lakeview Village and..."* I think it's because we are old or something they'll let us do that. They will then determine what response is necessary. Please remember that we are observers, reporters and rarely confronters.

Our cameras are great tools, so take pictures if it's safe. Write down as many details as possible as soon as possible! Remember to include the time of the incident, color of any vehicles involved, description of the perpetrators, and any other pertinent information that may be useful to share with others and the police. Be sure to file a police report when appropriate and keep a copy.

Speeding continues to be an issue so, take the lead out of your shoes— not to be confused with "getting the lead out." (Did you like what I did there?)

Back gate update: Well, no new gate yet. Hopefully, there will be one by the time you get this. Per the office, new concrete foundations were poured for the gate, and installation should happen any day.

Remember the "Circle of Safety" that surrounds you and your immediate neighbors. Get to know each other and find at least one neighbor that you could contact for help or advice.

The **non-emergency # for CHPD is 916-727-5500** and use 911 if there is any immediate threat to person or property. Always remain aware of your surroundings and be diligent in protecting our park and fellow residents.

Finally, remember to reserve 6:30 p.m. each 3rd Wednesday of the month for our future meetings. We look forward to seeing you at our **next meeting, May 15th!**

Driver's License Renewal for Seniors (new program)

The first DMV license renewal you take when you are 70 (or 70+) will require a physical visit to your local office for a vision test and a multiple-choice knowledge exam. The exam is 25 questions with the maximum you can miss is 5 to pass the test. A better choice might be taking the written exam online. Taking the exam online (at home) as an option most likely results in one getting 100% of the exam correct, first time, as it is almost impossible to fail. The online exam is sort of a self-study process broken into 7 segments. You read an applicable portion of the DMV Handbook for 3 or 4 questions that follow for each segment. Don't worry about missing a question(s). You get to take this over and over again until you select all the correct answers, segment by segment.

Of course, you always have the option of taking the exam in the DMV office, (closed book) but remember that the pass rate for the first DMV exam taking is lower than 50%. Therefore, the better choice might be to take the exam on the internet and print out your proof of passing. The only downside to this is getting bumped off the internet while taking your exam, but supposedly the DMV has fixed this. Also, the

online taking of the exam may not apply if you are over 80.

Recyclables include: any container with a CRV label, plastic water and juice bottles, beer and wine bottles and cans (including empty boxed wine). Non recyclables include: tin cans, food containers, coffee and tea bottles and cans, cosmetics, plastic cups, all hazardous materials.

BINGO

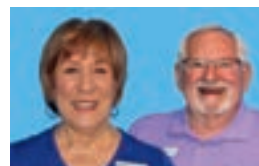

Every tomato lover knows "DO NOT REFRIGERATE". Cold will destroy the flavor and texture Unless it is 100% ripe, and then only for a few days. To store one that is not 100% cent ripe, try stem side up in a spot between 55-70 degrees and never in the sun.

Cook a roast with the fat side up; the juices soak down into the meat and keep it basted and moist.

Pork chops soaked in milk before frying or broiling will not become hard on the outside.
